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**Storage of Weapons for Private Individuals**  
**Colorado Revised Statutes, §13-14-105.5**

An individual subject to a protection order to prevent domestic violence, a protection order that prohibits a person from possessing a firearm or a person charged with Domestic Violence in the City & County of Denver or a resident of the City & County of Denver that is required to relinquish control of their firearms, as mandated in **CRS §13-14-105.5**, may elect to have the Denver Police Department store them. The Denver Police Department **will not** accept ammunition as it relates to this statute. Individuals affected by this statute will have to find an alternate location to store or dispose of ammunition.

If the affected individual elects to store their weapon with the Denver Police Department they shall do the following:

1. Contact the Denver Police Property Bureau at **720 913-6718 Monday through Friday between the hours of 0830 and 1630** to arrange for delivery of the weapon to the Police Department.
2. A member of the Property Bureau will obtain a GO Number for the incident and complete a DPD Property Invoice acknowledging receipt of the weapon. A copy of the evidence invoice will be given to the submitting individual to comply with the receipt requirement of the law.
3. The submitting individual will be informed in writing that there is a storage fee of \$3.64 per month for each weapon received by the Denver Police Department. The fee must be paid prior to the release of the weapon.
4. The submitting individual will receive a written notice that the weapon will be held for one year from the date of submission and then disposed of unless a written request to extend the original hold, by up to six months, is received by the Denver Police Property Bureau prior to the one year disposal authorization date.
5. The submitting individual must successfully pass a CBI InstaCheck background clearance prior the weapon being released.
6. The submitting individual must sign the form acknowledging the authority of the Denver Police to dispose of the weapon after one year if not claimed, agree to pay the storage fee and pass a CBI InstaCheck background clearance prior to the weapon being released.
